The GSBM also offers an Entrepreneurship Minor to undergraduates, as well as a MBA course on Innovation and Entrepreneurship and a doctoral seminar in Entrepreneurship Theory to Ph.D. students. From this program, students discover the opportunities for new ventures and identify attributes of successful entrepreneurs, and the processes they use to achieve success.
